Trustee: Mr. Marvin Duarte

- Milton is growing at a rapid pace, and we need more schools
- Government has approved one secondary Catholic school, and one elementary Catholic school
- Plans have been sent to the ministry
- Milton #10: ministry has given approval, and has agreed to release funds
- Shovels should be in the ground soon
- School has looked very different this year
- Mr. Duarte's focus has been on student success. Lots of progress in new programs and availability (French Immersion)
- Looking for long term solutions to program growth by setting up a boundary review, and looking at long-term strategic plan
- Mr. Duarte is the Chair of Halton Catholic Children's Foundation: helps families in need
- Asking Council to spread awareness of the foundation; help is available for those who need it

Principal's Report

Catholic School Council Meeting #3 – January 25th, 2021

<u>ACHIEVING</u>

- Face to face learning was occurring alongside the operation of the HCDSB virtual school prior to the Christmas Break.
- Remote learning and our virtual school have been running alongside each other since returning from the Christmas break due to this period of closure for in-school learners.

- The main change from the remote learning that was happening in the Spring of 2020 is that the minimum, asynchronous (live) teaching minutes have been dictated by the Ministry of Education. Teachers must provide 225 minutes of live teaching per day from Grade 1-8 and 180 minutes per day in Kindergarten. These minutes can be comprised of whole group instruction, small group instruction and/or one-on-one time with students.
- Teachers and students are adapting and learning new ways to teach and to show what they know.
- All Special Education intervention programs and student supports, run through our Special Education team, are continuing (being done virtually).
- Reading program is also running virtually
- The most recent "Change in Learning Environment Survey" which closed on Monday, December 7th has not seen the "change over date" occur. This will happen once we return to face to face learning.
- Teachers are preparing to enter report card writing. Many workshops and "drop in office hours" have been provided to teachers to receive extra support in writing reports during this period of virtual learning.
- Term 1 report cards will go home to parents on Wednesday, February 24th, 2021.
- There have been new, recent decisions at the board level regarding the accommodation of the Early French Immersion program for the 2021-2022 school year. We have just learned that 2 classes of Grade 1's will be at Scholastica and 2 classes of Grade 1's will be at St. Peter's. Students from the lottery will be placed based on their home Family of Schools (Either St. FX or Bishop Reding).
- A big shout out goes to all of our parents who have been doing such a phenomenal job supporting their children at home, all while trying to work and take care of other responsibilities.

BELIEVING

- Our New Year's/St. Scholastica Feast Day Liturgy will be happening virtually this upcoming Friday, January 29th and it will be led by our French Immersion students.
- First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation forms will be going home soon to get ready for these sacraments to take place.
- Last year's Grade 2 students (current Grade 3's) will be included in the sacrament of First Communion this year.
- There is still so much uncertainty with the government and diocese protocols. Once we have a clear direction from the diocesan authorities and the government, we will be able to set up ceremony dates and times.
- There may be a guest restriction (as in number of guests permitted) for these sacraments if there are restrictions for numbers of people in the church just me thinking out loud.

- St. Benedict Parish Church is still awaiting the go-ahead for occupancy from the inspectors with the Town of Milton.

BELONGING

- We are looking to do some spirit days during this period of remote learning.
- Teachers are really working to keep students' spirits up during this time of school closure.
- Teachers planning for Bell "Let's Talk Day" this upcoming Thursday (supports and activities provided to the teachers).
- Teachers are also planning for Black History Month in the same way. We are hoping that we will be back together for part of February and that we will be able to incorporate some student announcements as we journey through February together.

COVID Re-Opening Protocols

- COVID protocols were continuing to go well for our students and staff (albeit time consuming) up until the Christmas Break.
- We had a number of closed classrooms in the month of December (3 in total).
- In all of our confirmed COVID-19 cases, the affected students had contracted the virus through community spread and not school spread (i.e., no outbreaks).
- Since re-opening in the Fall we have had <u>four cases</u> at our school resulting in four classrooms that were closed for a period of time. Again – all were cases of community spread.
- Hand washing will need to be reviewed and still needs to be strictly reinforced once the students return to face to face learning
- New procedures have been added to our COVID re-opening Protocol as directed by the Ministry of Education. These include mask wearing in the hallways when students are on the way to outdoor play, during outdoor recess play and in the hallways once returning inside from recess. These will come into effect when we return to face to face learning.
- DPA can still be done without masks as long as the classroom teacher can enforce physical distancing.
 - o This can be applied to mask breaks, with strict supervision
- Locker procedures were going well before Christmas and we anticipate lockers remaining open for outdoor clothing only (following the protocols for number of students in the halls at a time etc.)
