Achieving

Focus on Math: On Nov. 19 and Nov. 20, Mrs. Wrixon-Relf and Mrs. Jobity attended a 2-day workshop with expert Alex Lawson, and Mrs. Meredith and Mrs. Wieshar participated in specialized meetings as Division Leaders on Dec. 4. Admin also participates in regular math education sessions run by the Curriculum Dept. Math professional development to be a standing item on staff meeting agendas and is a major focus of the School and Board Improvement Plan.
