- 6. All submissions should be sent to kozakma@hcdsb.org by no later than December 4th
- 7. The videos will be spliced together by none other than Mrs. Kozak and some of her talented Grade 8 students and posted to YouTube (with comments disabled) until January 4, 2021 at which point the video will be removed.
- 8. *** NOTE by submitting a video for the *OLP Wishes You a Merry Christmas Digital Christmas Card!* you give OLP permission to post your children's/family's greeting on YouTube for anyone to access/view.
- 9. Remember that this event is optional to participate in but everyone will have viewing access.
