## 3. Principal and Vice Principal's Report

- a. School Organization for 2017-18
  - We are expecting to have approximately 880 students for the 2017/18 school year.
  - We are adding 2 additional portables on the north side of the school to the fleet of portables currently on the property.
  - The school board is extending the pavement to accommodate the need for more portables.
  - The maximum number of portables allowed on school property is 12.
  - We are also adding two new teachers.
  - We have 41 grade 8 students graduation, 15 French immersion transfers & 5 or 6 early French immersion transfers.
  - The HCDSB early French immersion program is currently under review for 2018/2019.
- b. Memorial bench
  - The student that tragically passed away last summer would have graduated this year.
  - We had a prayer service at the beginning of the year when students came back from summer holidays, a mass as well as a plaque displayed in the chapel.
  - We would also like to do something special to remember the student this year.
  - As every graduation group has a mascot, they chose a butterfly this time to convey that 'tragedy has brought them closer together'. The graduates would like to have an iron bench with a butterfly added outside of the library in memory of their fellow student.
- c. Financial Update
  - Teachers in grade 3 and Ms. Hunter have applied for a Teacher Learning and Leadership Program grant.
  - Only two schools were chosen and our school was one of them.
  - The grant lasts for almost two years and some of the money will go to the library.
  - There is a huge reporting component involved but this is a very exciting opportunity as only few schools get selected for this.

## 5. Committee Reports and Updates

- a. Roselien Markovic and Lisa White: Family Fun Night Updates
  - FFN was a success; we collected approx. \$5,500.
  - We learned a few things for next year.
  - Volunteers and students were great, thank you.

- Harvey's sold 875 burgers/hot dogs/veggie burgers and we receive a % of their profit.
- The weather was great and the organization and help from volunteers was great.

- The question was asked whether we could have a bouncy castle next time but this cannot be added due to HCDSB insurance.
- The kids loved the treasure hunt. Thank you grade 7 students for coming up with the questions.
- b. Thyrza Naraine: Staff Appreciation Luncheon
  - Thyrza was not able to attend the meeting today but Ms. Barden is able to provide an update.
  - Food and coffee/drinks have already been ordered.
  - We would really need some parent volunteers.
  - There has not been much communication about it.
  - Thursday's set up has been organized.
  - There will be a catered buffet.
  - We would need parent volunteers for Friday from 11am to 1pm.
- c. Bonnie Dey and Celeste Celec: Uniform Exchange
  - The uniform exchange has all been set up and they have volunteers.
  - All is going well.
  - Will get a cash box for \$2 purchases.
  - Items will go on sale on Thursday for purchase & Wednesday for exchange.
  - Thank Bonnie & Celeste!!!
  - We have received our Gold EcoSchools Certification which requires a number of initiatives of energy conservation and waste reduction.
  - We have received this certification the 2nd year in a row and the uniform exchange program is one of our initiatives.
- **d.** Kerstin Baker-Ash: Discussion about the logistics of adding a sidewalk along the north and south perimeters (e.g. parallel to Pringle) of the school in order to partially negate the need to cross the entry/exit to the parking lots.
  - It is very busy every morning to get in and out of the parking lot near Pringle.
  - What are the barriers & cost to add a sidewalk to avoid crossing the parking lot.
  - This idea has come up last year already but it is just too expensive to do something like that.
  - Perhaps we can approach this as a parent safety issue.
  - As we will lose a row of parking this may not be feasible with our already limited space.
  - There are already not enough parking spaces.
  - Kerstin will look at the bylaw requirements for sidewalk width.
  - If we could get a smaller sidewalk perhaps?

- Another school has cut off the kiss and ride lane and now they have only a kiss and ride for Kindergarten.
- Parent Question: "Can we not open the fence on the Kindergarten side for easier access?"
- This has already been explored two years ago.
- This was looked at with the superintendent, however grading, and winter maintenance was one issue and the other issue was safety as we would create a new access point for strangers
- Parent Question: "What if we only permit right turns out of the parking lot after school?"
- We have also already investigated that option but as we are too close to a stop sign on that side we will have another line up on the street and would create new problem.
- Thank you for all the ideas unfortunately we have already investigated all of them.
