- 2. Opening Prayer (Parish Representative Marvin Duarte to lead or select someone (2 min),
 - Read by Marvin Duarte

- 3. Principal and Vice Principal's Report (J. Susi and V. Varano) (40 min)
 - a. FDK Playground Safety Guidelines
 - Further information was provided in regards to the question form the last meeting concerning the safety of the wagons and tricycles in the FDK school yard.
 - We are following the HCDSB's FDK safety guidelines.
 - All items are purchased centrally in order for all schools to have the same equipment.
 - All staff members have been made aware of the safety guidelines and reviewed these with the students.
 - Tricycles: riders need to be seated; no standing on back; one person only
 - Wagons: must be stopped for students to get on or off; can only be pulled not pushed; must walk not run, students seated only, one student at a time, etc.
 - We do our utmost to make sure that all children are safe
 - Visual inspections of equipment are performed daily
 - Anything broken is repaired or removed immediately
 - Further information was provided in regards to questions from the last meeting about a rubberized kindergarten playground
 - The rubber material is specifically designed to support high play structures (i.e. slides, swings, etc.), as we do not have any play structure we would not require this type of surface as per HCDSB safety guidelines.
 - We need to consider that children need to learn to play on all surfaces
 - They need to learn to negotiate space and their environment
 - Teachers supervise as a prudent parents would
 - Reminders & lessons are provided to keep the play area a safe place
 - There was some discussion about the pros and cons and potential safety concerns about the use of wagons and tricycles in the FDK yard, including whether or not helmets need to be worn by students.
 - Mr. Susi assured those present that we are following all HCDSB safety guidelines in these regards, we will continue with appropriate supervision and we will continue to use these items during outdoor play.
 - There was also discussion about whether or not we are following proper weight restriction guidelines for wagons. Mr. Susi produced a manufacturer's document to verify that the maximum weight restriction is 75lbs so we are in compliance.
 - The bike helmet law is only in effect if in public but is not mandatory on private property, which schools are
 - We are not able to share helmets due to possible lice problems, proper fitting of individual helmets, supervision of the proper fitting of helmets, etc.
 - To implement this with that many kids would not be practical

b. South Yard Fence – gate required

- The possibility of a gate in the fenced area adjacent to the walk way has been asked about previously in order for parents and children to get to the school yard quickly and safely without going near the road
- The town of Milton owns this fence
- A parent and Mr. Susi are following up with the town of Milton and will advise the outcome

c. Care and Treatment Program

- This is a Self-contained classroom that will be housed at QH next year in room 110. It is a partnership between both HCDSB and HDSB. There will be a maximum of 6 students in this class. It is for students who may have suffered emotional trauma or high anxiety. They will be supported through this program on a short term basis and will be reintegrated back to their home school. There is no integration with our classrooms or students.
- Therapist oversees the program with a teacher, and two Child and Youth Workers. 50% therapy, 50% academics
- 9am to 2pm modified school day. Students are bused from their home school.
- Once intensive therapy is completed, children may be integrated back into their home school.
- JK to grade 3

d. School Organization for 2015-16

- We currently have approx. 665 students
- Expecting approx. 740 for the next school year
- Enrolment is 'bottom heavy', as our young students get older we will increase the overall student enrolment
- We will have 3 portable next year in addition to filling our two currently open classrooms
- Our music room will become a regular classroom
- The school property is Ministry approved for a potential of 12 future portables
- Next year, portables will be placed in the corner of the south pavement area
- The three grade 5 classes will be out in portables for the next school year

e. School Generated Funds Budget Overview

- We have raised an amazing amount of money this year
- We had estimated 39,000 but are now at approx. 50,000 of projected income

- 6. Ministry of Education's Revised "Physical Education Curriculum: Human Development and Sexual Health"- Mr. Susi (5 min)

How is the HCDSB implementing this?

- There has been a lot of attention about this in the media
- The board has sent a letter to parents about this in February (a copy was distributed at the meeting, please see below)
- This should have answers to most questions on how this will be taught
- This Revised Health and Phys Ed Curriculum is available online on ministry website
- The guideline is revised and broken into 3 sections
- 3rd part, Healthy Living, is broken down again
- We have already been teaching the family life program as vetted through the Catholic Bishops which already covers a vast majority of the Sexual Education expectations as listed in the revise Health and Phys Ed document.
- While we have a responsibility to teach the curriculum set out by the Ministry of Education, we have always done so in a manner that conveys respect and models our Catholic values to our students.
- In the past there was not a problem or concern with our Family Life program so therefore should be fine moving forward. Teachers will receive documents and inservice in the fall to support their teaching of this.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

RE: Revisions to the Health & Physical Education Curriculum

We are writing to you in regard to today's release by the Ministry of Education of revisions to the Health and Physical Education (HPE) curriculum, including the 'Human Development and Sexual Health' section, which falls within the 'Healthy Living' strand.

As Catholics, we understand that parents and guardians are the primary educators of their children. Your role in the teaching of family life issues is pivotal and vital. As a Catholic school district, we work with our parents and our parishes to provide for our students an education that is founded in the Gospel of Jesus, and reflects a Catholic world view.

While we have a responsibility to teach the curriculum set out by the Ministry of Education in education policy, we have always done so in a manner that conveys, respects and models our Catholic values to our students. For more than 30 years, our schools, and all Catholic schools in Ontario, have successfully provided a family life curriculum within a Catholic framework under the guidance of the Catholic Bishops of Ontario through the *Fully Alive* program.

The vast majority of the revised curriculum is already covered within the *Fully Alive* program. Although some of the content has been reassigned, with the expectation that it be delivered in earlier grades, we are confident that we will be able to deliver the revised curriculum within the context of our Family Life program, in a way that is consistent with Church teachings, and our faith tradition. Now that the revised curriculum has been released, the Catholic education community of Ontario will work together to produce resources that support our Catholic teachers and ensure that the curriculum delivered in our classrooms is consistent with our Catholic teachings, and appropriate within the context of a Catholic classroom.

We want to assure you that as a Catholic school district, we will continue to offer a holistic curriculum that is shaped by a Catholic world view, and is faithful to the tradition and teachings of the Church.
