#### 3. What does a Catholic School Council do?

- Advisory body to the Principal that provides feedback or input on various decisions pertaining to the school. An agenda is created beforehand (topics may include but are not limited to Catholicity, School Improvement Planning, community events, fundraising budgets, areas of priority for our school, committee reports).
- We will use the consensus model of decision making and if necessary council members may vote on items.
- Email communication may be sent regarding info sharing or gathering. Emails can come from the chair and/or principal.

# Consensus Building

- Consensus is finding the highest level of agreement without dividing participants into factions. It is an important tool, but may not be needed for all decisions.
- Consensus is group decision making, based on willingness to consent and support, rather than having a winning and losing side by voting. It allows ownership of ideas by all School Council members as being the best choice.
- Consensus is a decision process for resolving conflicts. Consensus may be difficult to reach, so not every decision will meet with everyone's complete approval.

# What's beyond the scope of the School Council?

 A member shall direct a parent to use the established communication channels when questions or concerns arise rather than answering questions themselves when approached by a non-school council member.

# Creating a School Council – official declaration

- The School Council shall be comprised of appointed members in accordance with the
  policy governing School Councils as adopted from time to time by the Halton Catholic
  District School Board (hereinafter "Members of School Council").
- Parent candidates may be self-nominated or nominated by another parent or guardian to a maximum of one representative per household.
- The Principal will request for nominations of parent members which will be accepted up to and including the first School Council Meeting of the year.
- All nominated parent members will become official members of School Council for a one-year term.
- The Principal and Vice-Principal of the Queen of Heaven Catholic School shall be the only permanent Members of the School Council.

- Healthy Budget
- Money we raise is a combination from all areas listed under projected income
- we have to take into consideration one time charges (e.g. spiritual display) vs. annual expenses (e.g. engraving of plaques)
- Grade 3 to 8 classes ALL have smart projectors (with the exception of portables)
- We have to purchase the soap for the classroom sinks as the board only pays for the washroom soap and FDK soap
- **Parent Question**: Why are we being asked to purchase a recorder for the music class when it is a curriculum item?
  - o Purchase of the equipment is OPTIONAL
  - o Students may take home the school recorders to practice.
  - We offer students a sterilized recorder to use at school and home
- Parent Question: What is the budget for the library?
  - \$9 per student per year (x approx. 760 students)
  - We also host a book fair where we retain a percentage of the sales for future library purchases
  - o We would like to add a religious focal point for the library in the future
- Parent Question: Do we receive or have remaining initial startup funds?
  - We have used the funds received for our initial startup as per last year's budget; unspent money rolls over into the next year

- Going forward we will need to draw from our regular annual budget as outlined above
- ALL are in favor of the budget above

# d. Follow up on June 2015 re. Construction of fence gate

- A request was made to add a gate from the path near the pond to the area right by the portables
- Without this gate students and parents have to walk around to the end of the path and cross the entrance of the rather busy parking lot
- Furthermore they will have to walk past the FDK gates which are extremely busy in the morning and afternoon
- Unfortunately we are not able to provide this gate as per board safety guidelines
- Although the facilities supervisor was willing to place the gate as well as pave the
  walkway a decision was made by the Facilities Dept. that adding a gate is not safe
  due to the slope of the grade and potential ice during the winter month
- Also the fence is considered an extra security line to discourage easy access to the school yard
- We will however create another FDK gate to the fenced-in area adding one extra
  drop off spot in the hope that this will help alleviate some of the traffic collecting
  on the side walk during drop-off and pick-up for FDK

## e. Safety Committee and Kiss & Ride Update

- We have assigned additional staff members at both entrances to the parking lot in order to help direct the flow of students across both driveways before and after school
- As per police instructions it is neither legal nor safe for us to stop traffic on the main street but we are able to stop pedestrians on the sidewalk to help with the flow of people and as an extra, added safety measure
- We have also added an additional staff member for the north Kiss & Ride lanes so parents do not have to leave their car and traffic can more faster
- **Parent Question:** Should parents be allowed to park in the Kiss & Ride lane for pickup in the afternoon? This does not seem safe.
  - Without those parking spots we would have too much volume on the already overcrowded lot
  - o Ideas can be brought up to the safety committee
  - Signage has already been ordered that clearly indicates this to drivers

## 9. School Council Feedback

#### a. School Welcome Back BBQ

- There was some discussion from some members that they were not happy with the food that was provided
- Another school held their Welcome Back BBQ and Curriculum on the same night which made it rather hard to pay attention as all kids were present and playing during the curriculum presentation
- Having these events on two separate days, as we do, is much more organized and preferable

#### b. Curriculum Night

- As we are able to engage more with other parents at the curriculum night perhaps the order should be switched; having the curriculum night first and then the welcome back BBQ. This way parents have already met and can mingle more at the BBQ.
- Please keep in mind that 'Curriculum Night' is more of a historic name; the actual
  purpose of this evening is to give teachers a chance to address parents and explain
  how they are able to collaborate with the teacher to help their children learn. They
  are given a 10 minute time frame to highlight the most important points. The actual
  curriculum can be viewed online.
- Kids were very proud to present their classroom space during open house.
- Consider the time gap between presentations allowing parents with multiple children to visit all classrooms. Teachers' 10 minute presentations will need to stay on time. Currently we have 2 presentations at 7:30 and 8:00.
- Suggestions were made also to perhaps use the smart boards for the presentation so that parents have an idea how they work.
- Request was made to see if we can avoid having our nights at the same time as Jean
   Vanier to accommodate parents who have children in both schools.

# 10. Additions to the Agenda:

- a. Scott and Pringle Intersection Safety Concern
  - School bus transportation is only available for students living 1.6kms away from school
  - Families who live in the Scott & Pringle area but are only 1.3, 1.4 or 1.5kms away are not eligible for bus transportation

- Parents and students do not feel comfortable crossing the street at Scott & Pringle and there is NO crossing guard at that intersection
- The intersection is a 3 way stop but unfortunately many cars do not actually come to a complete stop as everyone is rushing
- There is a bit of a blind spot in that area as well as a bus stop on top of all the commotion
- This is definitely a safety concern for our students
- Police are occasionally present but do not have the resources to patrol the area constantly
- Even older children are not comfortable crossing the street at that intersection during school hours
- The Trustee of Milton was already asked by a parent to look in to this matter with the Town of Milton's Crossing Guard Supervisor but the parent community may also have a great influence with the Town
- It is believed that they will at least conduct a study of the area if parents voice concern
- We shall draft a letter from the parent council requesting a study to be conducted
- Perhaps this can be done in conjunction with the parent council of Escarpment View public school
- Christian Cepeda, Christina Prentice, Thyrza Naraine & Kelechi Akwiwu will look into this
