- We pay \$268.00 for the rental of the cotton candy machines and cones
- The cones were purchase from Amazon for a much better price and we have a lot left over for next year
- Christine Baxter has offered a contact if we would like to purchase bags instead
 of cones for the cotton candy next year
- We had 2 full bags of popcorn left over; Kernels have a school program so we
 were able to get the popcorn for a good price and still make a fairly decent profit
- Jay's ice cream was concerned about too many food vendors at the fair and thus did not participate; we should approach an ice cream truck for next year perhaps
- The basket raffle was a huge hit as always!
- The music was great and received a lot of good feedback
- We received the gummies for the scavenger hunt prize as a donation from Roselien and her kids packaged them for us...thank you
