School Parking Lot Safety - we continue to be very concerned about the safety within our two school parking lots. Mrs. Robinson & Mr. Starr passed out safety flyers last week to vehicles entering our parking lots at dismissal time. Please take some time to review the pints we have highlighted. As we all know, school parking lots were not designed or built for the volume of automobile traffic they currently sustain each day. Due to the congestion in the parking lots and unsafe practices exhibited by some drivers accessing the parking lots, we are **considering various parking lot options & strategies** that are <u>designed to</u> <u>protect student, staff and visitor safety</u>. Please expect a parking lot safety flyer to be handdelivered to drivers entering our lots over the coming weeks to forecast expectations and changes coming to our parking lots. In anticipation of these changes, WE HIGHLY RECOMMEND PARNTS PARKING ON NEIGHBOURING SIDE STREETS AND WALKING ONTO SCHOOL PROPERTY TO PICK UP CHILDREN AT

DISMISSAL TIME. We will continue to monitor the parking lot hoping to see vehicles not double-parking in the live lanes to allow cars to freely exit their parking spots.
