

Please ensure that your child is wearing the RJ McCarthy issued uniform. Pants from other retail stores are not part of standard uniform code.

KISS 'N' RIDE DROP OFF PROGRAM

To help to alleviate any congestion in the parking lot, we ask that if you drive your children to school, please drop them off at the side area which is designated as the KISS 'N' RIDE drop off area. DO NOT DROP THEM OFF AT THE FRONT OF THE SCHOOL AS THIS IS FOR OUR BUSES. If you wish to come into the school



or take your children to the JK/SK playground area of the school, please park in the parking lot and walk them over. Do not park along the drop off area. This is a very serious safety concern for our students.

The front of the school is for buses only. For the safety of all, we remind you to avoid this area. We have instructed all students to enter and exit the building by the rear doors. Students should make every effort to be in the school yard prior to the first bell at 9:05am so that they can join their class. If they miss their class entry, they can join another line. Entry through the front doors of the school is only permitted once the 2nd bell at 9:10am has gone and all students have entered the rear of the building and the doors are closed. At this time they are considered late and must proceed to the office to receive a late slip.

If you are picking up your child at lunchtime or end of day, please meet them by the fence at the back of the school as we encourage all students to be dismissed out the back.

Also, please keep in mind that the driveway area at the front of the school is a fire route. Vehicles are not permitted to park here at any time. In order to avoid an expensive parking ticket, you are best to park in one of our parking lots on the east and west side of the school building. You must have a handicap sign in your car in order to park in the handicap parking spots. Otherwise you run the risk of an expensive ticket.

when on a lease. Furthermore, many of our younger students are afraid of dogs. Please adhere to this rule for the safety of all.


LUNCH DROP OFF

SEAC SOUNDBYTES



What is an IEP? An IEP is an Individual Education Plan. IEP's are developed for students who have been placed in a special education program whether or not

they meet the formal definition of "exceptional".

The IEP provides a series of "educational targets" for a variety children who mav accommodations, modifications and/or alternative programming. The IEP includes several important features including specific educational expectations and outlines the special education program and services that will be received by the student. The IEP must be developed in consultation with parents. Parental involvement in the IEP process is crucial and collaborative. Collaboration with parents and older students will help to ensure that the expectations are attainable. The IEP must be completed within 30 days after a student has been placed in a program and the Principal must ensure that the parent receives a copy. The IEP is a working document which is intended to be reviewed and updated as needed, with a minimum of once per term or semester.

Did you know that a plan for transition to appropriate postsecondary school activities, such as work, further education and/or community living must be included in the IEP?
