## French Immersion: (Susi)

- Board meeting in Jan. approved motion that went forward to not have French immersion waitlist. We will have up to 4 Grade 1 classes.
- Grade 9 French Immersion Board will create appropriate curriculum and programming for 2021 at Notre Dame in Burlington. Currently house the extended French immersion program. Curriculum is being developed.
- School Organization for September growing for French Immersion (2 additional grade 1 classes and two grade 8 classes for next year, English classes decline by 1 class.
   School is at capacity. We will have up to four portables for next year.

### **Cancellations (Cochrane)**

- Ottawa (no return of \$100 deposit) and Camp (all funds refunded) cancelled according to Board. Reimbursements to come to families from the BrightSpark company (may be delayed due to volume of schools they work with)
- There was a \$100 nonrefundable deposit made to company BrightSpark (option was offered for \$45 cancellation insurance) TICO Jess Mitchel informed of travel regulations
- Lunch fees are being reimbursed and still being processed Pizza, Milk, Salad bar, LunchBox
- Refunding of lunch programs will affect fundraising amounts and will decrease school expenditures (i.e. Computer purchases)
- Graduation ceremonies no formal decision has been made yet, as soon as available, communication will be made.
- Supporting Families in need: some families from the school are in need. Have been dropped off Halton Food for thought using gift cards from salad bar. Redirected funds from salad bar to families in need.

#### (Mr. Susi)

- Students who required technology were provided with school laptops and wifi assistance. 20+ in total families were given a school laptop as well as students with SEA Special Ed laptop (18 families)
- Let John or Darren know if there are other families in need of support within the school community.

#### **Distance Learning feedback from Parents:**

- Teachers advised not to communicate with students through live video or audio at this point
- Positive feedback for the most part, understanding of issues
- Work is similar to what it would be at school
- Request to upload over the weekend so that parents have time to map out the week
- Request to have live chats with the class. John said that the distance learning may evolve into live chat through Teams in the future
- Request for schedule at the beginning of the week to help with time management (?)
- John mentioned that if teachers were already using an online platform that they could continue to use it, however, those that were not already using an established platform were to use D2L
- One parent commented that Math Up was confusing
- Request for gallery view of classmates and teachers.
- John said that Teachers were receiving inservice on how to use MathUp and using it online.
- Provide required activities as well as optional additional activities

- Gr 7 created survey to determine where students are with their online learning
- Video and audio if it's live, it feels more like a lesson. This feels just like giving and getting assignments. Otherwise lesson/activity is less engaging.
- Grades? Assessment for learning feedback only, there will be a report card, teachers
  will provide a mark or comment gr 1-8 literacy, math, science, Social Studies. Will look at
  the work that they did up to March 13. The online work that they have been doing may
  positively affect their report cards. Assessment of learning cannot be done because of
  varying levels of parent support, inequalities within families. We need to focus on
  students improving their skills, not just on marks.
