Stephany B. also shared an overview of our EQAO results:

Grade 3: 98% reading, 95% writing and 92% math Grade 6: 89% reading, 90% writing and 75% math (% denotes # of students that scored a 3 or 4)

Stephany B. advised council that the school will be required to conduct 2 bomb threat drills this year as part of the protocol.

Also discussed was the notice our school community received about the PAR-Pupil Accommodation review, including our F.O.S. We are required to send 1 council and 1 non council parent representative to the meetings on behalf of the St. Andrew population. Sue E. has volunteered as our council member representative.
