Spring is around the corner and time to get active! Cycling is a fun and healthy activity, it's a low-cost way to get around, and it's good for the planet. Cyclists have to share the road with cars, pedestrians and other cyclists.

Before you head out on a bike, learn the rules of the road, helmet information and safety tips for cyclists of all ages.

As recommended by Parachute Canada:

Always wear a helmet. Properly worn, it can reduce the risk of serious head injury by up to 80%. Know and follow the 2V1 Rule.

Be prepared. Know the rules of the road.

Check your ride. A fun and safe cycling experience starts with a properly equipped bicycle.

Be a role model. Set a good example and practice safety together.

Looking Ahead—Class Organization for September 2017

School staff will soon be meeting to establish class lists for September. There is a process that is designed to come up with the best placement for your child. Prior to making decisions around such placements, a number of factors as well as projected enrolment are considered. The following criteria are used to create balanced classes:

- 1. Overall academic achievement
- 2. Learning skills
- 3. Social grouping and friendships
- 4. Best match of students' learning style with the teaching style
- 5. Special learning considerations
- 6. Balanced number of boys & girls

The best social, spiritual and academic interests of your child are at the heart of our decisions, and with the input and guidance of teachers and administration, final decisions for placement are made. Parents are invited to share specific information regarding their child's personal development to assist us in the placement process. Any parent letters or communication regarding class placement should be directed to the Principal by Friday, May 12 in writing, to Mrs. Balogh's attention. Letters are reviewed, however, not all requests can be met.

Grade 3 and 6 EQAO Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics **Primary Division and Junior Division**

Similar to previous years, our Grade 3 and 6 students will participate in the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) Primary and Junior Division assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics between:

Tuesday, May 23 and Monday, June 5, 2017.

These EQAO assessments will continue to be administered to all students in Grades 3 and 6. Students will be required to complete three test booklets: one mathematics booklet, one reading booklet and one writing booklet. The types of questions in the booklets will be familiar to your child as they are based on the kinds of work your child has been doing throughout the year. The total amount of time that the students will spend on the testing will be six hours that is generally spread over the course of three days. Sample questions can be viewed on the EQAO website at www.egao.com.

We ask that you make every effort to avoid holidays during these days and to try to make sure your children are in attendance each day during the assessment. In advance, we appreciate your efforts in scheduling appointments around this block of time. The EQAO assessment results help us to continue to improve upon the quality Catholic education offered to your children.

PARKING LOT REMINDERS!

We appreciate and respect the staff who do their best daily, to keep your children safe and who work to keep the traffic moving smoothly at the beginning and end of each

Please do your part, and abide by the following:

- Drive slowly and cautiously at all times,
- Do not park and leave your car in the "kiss 'n ride" area along the curb adjacent to the school.
