- 6. Balanced number of boys & girls



Education Quality and Accountability Office



Grade 3 and 6 EQAO
Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics
Primary Division and Junior Division

Just a reminder, our **Grade 3 and 6 students** will participate in the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) Primary and Junior Division assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics between **Wednesday**, **May 24 and Monday**, **May 29**, **2017**.

These EQAO assessments will be administered to all students in Grades 3 and 6. Students will be required to complete three booklets: one mathematics booklet, one reading booklet and one writing booklet. The total amount of time that the students will spend on the testing will be six hours that is generally spread over the course of three days. Sample questions and more information can be viewed on the EQAO website at www.egao.com.

We ask that you make every effort to avoid holidays or appointments during these days to ensure your children are in attendance each day during the assessment. Please notify your child's teacher if there are any issues that may affect the administration of the assessment for your child, we can try and make any accommodations. The EQAO assessment results help us to continue to provide important information and is used for the improvement of planning.

All About Me (K-6) and the 21st Century Competencies

Across Ontario, schools are being prompted to help students develop the 21st century competencies that will enable them to face complex challenges now and in the future. The competencies, including critical thinking and problem solving, communication, collaboration, creativity and innovation, self-awareness and self-directed learning, and global citizenship, are directly supported using All About Me (K-6) and myBlueprint (7-12). Students can easily demonstrate creativity and innovation by adding their own journal entries, pictures, files, and videos related to their learning and personal experiences. They can also add highly engaging, directed artifacts to promote self-directed learning and exploration. Each artifact has its own date-stamped reflection to ensure that students are thinking critically, practicing self-awareness, and self-directed learning. INTERMEDIATE TRANSITIONAL MATH CAMP



This two week summer program is designed for students who would benefit from additional practice and assistance to ease their transition into Grade 8 & 9. As part of the program, students will have access to computers.

LITERACY THROUGH THE ARTS CAMP

The arts can play a vital role in literacy. Students can be initially engaged in reading by focusing on their comprehension and enjoyment of a given story, poem, chant, or rhyme. Fundamentally, balanced literacy revolves around two primary strands, a reading strand and a writing strand, each of which mirrors the other.



NUMERACY THROUGH ROBOTICS CAMP



Robotics is a motivational tool that brings math, science and technology to life in the classroom. Robotics enables students to "do" mathematics rather than study it. Robotics offers students a unit of study that implicitly demonstrates the application of math, science and technology as well as reinforce numeracy skills such as Numbers and Operations, Algebra, Geometry, Measurement, Problem Solving, Reasoning and Proof; and Communications. Students will have a basic understanding of sensor based measurements, applications for angles, counted and timed events and other computer-based math.

Principal and teacher recommendations are requested for these programs, however, parents may initiate an application. Registration forms are available from your child's school/teacher and must be returned to the home school.

Parents are responsible for transportation arrangements for all programs.

You will be contacted ONLY if your course is full, transferred or cancelled, otherwise, report to the summer school location on the first day.
