- 3. Click on Elementary school placement
- 4. Enter OEN, click search
- 5. Your child's name, school year and placement will be displayed
 - On the first day of school, teachers will be in our schoolyard holding a sign with the grade and name.
 - Parents/Guardians are respectfully asked to avoid entering the hallways or visiting classrooms on the first day of school. With a projected 750 students, the goal is to keep the classes moving so everything runs as smoothly as possible.

Bus Transportation for Fall

Route information for your child is available online at the transportation website at <u>www.haltonbus.ca</u>. To access this information, you will need your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN) which appears on the top of all of your child's report cards. Courtesy seat forms will be available in the school office starting June 1st. Bus stops and times will be posted on the front doors of the school during the first week of September. Students should be waiting at bus stops at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled bus arrival time. Parents are encouraged to sign up for email alerts about late buses online at halotnbus.ca.


St. Andrew Greening

Sunny Days

With the warm, beautiful days of spring and summer approaching, parents need to be aware of, and take action to prevent damage from the sun's rays to your child(ren)'s skin. Students are outside for two separate 15 minute recess breaks and a 40 minute lunch recess break each day.

Parents are responsible for seeing that their children wear appropriate clothing, a hat and sun block. If a parent decides to send sun block to school, please understand that staff **will not** be responsible for the application of the lotion.

Dress Code



With the warmer weather soon upon us, we remind students that they are expected to dress in a manner appropriate to a Catholic School setting. Students are encouraged to dress modestly at school. We ask that students not wear: tank tops, muscle shirts, halter tops, or very short shorts. Bare midriffs are also unacceptable.

T-shirts with inappropriate or offensive language and/or pictures are not allowed at school. Students who wear unacceptable clothing to school will be asked to make other arrangements for a change of clothing.

We thank parents and students for cooperating with our school dress code.

West Nile Virus



Is my child at risk for becoming infected with West Nile virus while attending school? The mosquitoes that most commonly carry West Nile virus are generally more active during the early evening to early morning. The school yards are mainly located in open areas on asphalt or short grass/dirt – not conducive for harbouring mosquitoes. As well, the school is actively involved in reducing mosquito breeding sites (standing water) and resting sites on school property. Children are at minimal risk for exposure to mosquitoes and no precautions are needed.

PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES, INCLUDING CELL PHONES

We would like to remind our students and families of the policies around the acceptable use of personal electronic devices on school premises. Students who bring a cell phone or any personal electronic device to school must "demonstrate digital citizenship through the appropriate use of technology, as outlined in our school Code of Conduct." They must use "board technology for curriculum-related/educational purposes only." Lastly, in order to maintain the order and safety of our students, they are to use the office phone to contact parents during the instructional day, with permission from the teacher.

Bike Safety

Students are welcome to bring their bikes to school. Please review the following safety requirements:

- 1. Cyclists up to the age of 18 must wear a bicycle helmet according to Ontario law;
 - Bicycles may never be ridden on school property. All students will walk their bikes when on the school site; bikes are to be locked up when parked in the school bike racks.
 - 3. Riders need to know and understand the rules of the road;
 - Bicycles must be road worthy and conform to municipal requirements for licensing, operation and equipment. #biketoschoolHCDSB
