### **Greetings and Opening Prayer**

Susan E. opened the meeting, by welcoming all. Kelly W. (VP), led us in the opening Prayer for Mindfulness

## **Business Arising from our last Meeting:**

<u>Lunch Box Orders</u>: Kelly W (VP). reported that the response has been overall very good and that Lunchbox has been very accommodating in looking after any issues. The older students are managing the distribution to each classroom and generating approximately \$185 in profit for school funds.

- a) It was suggested and decided to add a different venue for Thursdays and that administration would ask student council on which one should be added.
- b) <u>PRO Grant:</u> Susan E. had asked for ideas from council for submission of the application by the June 5 deadline. "The Learning Tree" was suggested as it is an excellent parent engagement vehicle and additionally it incorporates the provincial focus on math. The organization would come to the school and run the event, and there is no additional work for school staff. Council voted, and the majority of council were in favour of submitting this idea for our application. It was also discussed to schedule the event earlier in the school year so that students could benefit from what they learn for the balance of the school year. Wed. Oct. 17 was selected as the date and Lorraine B. will book the gym in advance for this purpose. Also, it was decided that Tues. Feb 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019 would also be blocked off for a 2<sup>nd</sup> parent engagement night, as we always have Thursdays available.
- c) <u>BBQ Review: May 31, 2018:</u> Kelly W. confirmed they are in the midst of taking inventory of the existing prizes and that all is proceeding on schedule. The next BBQ meeting is scheduled for May 9<sup>th</sup> and that information is being sent home to parents on May 1<sup>st</sup>
- **d)** <u>Student Council Updates:</u> Kelly W. (VP) advised that council has planted a vegetable garden in pots that started from seedlings. Student council also led an assembly to honour the victims of the Florida shootings which involved a liturgy and ended with a silent symbolic walk around the playground. The focus of this event was about being kind and having empathy for others. On the same day, the Grade 7's also had their dance and were given ice cream sandwiches at the end. Lastly with the Speak Out grant monies student council received, they purchased T-shirts for council members as well as for the Safe School Action team.
- e) <u>Family of Schools Joint Council Meeting Apr. 9<sup>th</sup></u>: Susan E. provided a recap of the meeting, explaining that there was an exercise concerning social media. There was discussion that in future, there could more time dedicated so that we could expand further on more topics, and engage with the other schools more. Following the 30 minute session, the Social Media presentation with Chris Vollum took place. Lorraine B. advised council that Chris Vollum will be presenting to St. Andrew students on June 18<sup>th</sup>, with 2 separate Junior and Senior student presentations.
- f) <u>Parking Issues:</u> It seems that problems have dissipated with less snow, but remains problematic with the dangerous layering of cars in multiple lanes in the kiss n' ride area. It was decided that Lorrain B. will contact the Town of Oakville to determine what action can be taken to ensure only 1 lane of cars drives through the Kiss n' Ride area.
- g) <u>H.C.C.E.F. Charity Golf Classic Donation</u>: There was discussion that at the BBQ, the names of 2 willing students would be selected from a draw, to golf with 2 teachers. This would be in lieu of the gift card and basket that council usually supply. A motion was put forth by Elisabeth M. and second by Susan E., for Council to cover the cost of our St. Andrew foursome.
