Achieving: Meeting the Needs of All Learners

- .) Educators will engage in professional development around metacognitive, reflective and assessment as learning practices.
- 2) Educators will explicitly teach the reasonableness of an answer
- 3) Learning goals will be communicated clearly and co-created success criteria will be used consistently
- 4) Teachers will model descriptive feedback to help students improve self and peer assessment

Believing: Celebrating our Catholic faith and aspiring to be models of Christ

-) Teachers and students will co-create success criteria around the focus on faith questions and the virtues
- 2) Students will understand how their behaviours and actions exemplify our Catholicity.
- B) Students will recognize when someone is demonstrating Catholic values, enabling them to become self-reflective lifelong learners.
