Each school year, we select one major fundraising activity for the year ... this year we continued with our Hallowe'en Dancea-thon. Thank you for <u>your</u> generosity and dedication to our school ... as you can see below, you have made a true difference!

Overall, our profit from the *Hallowe'en Dance-a-thon* was: **\$22,000.00** Additional fundraising revenue was generated from *Pizza Days and our Milk Program* **\$55,000.**

We spent the money in the following ways:

- Additional funding to support technology in the classroom (\$40 000.00)
 - (i.e.,) Dell Laptops (25), Tech tubs and carts, replacement LCD projectors for classrooms, replacement of whiteboards, iPad covers, USB camera,
- School Beautification and Renewal (\$30,000)
 - (i.e.,) touch up painting of common areas, landscaping, banners for sports, graduation awards large wall plaque, additional shelving for school library, new furniture in library, lego table, mobile bins for kindergarten, privacy blinds for 11 portables, Catholic Graduate expectations decals on forum windows, gym window decals
- Student Events (\$10, 000)
 - Parent/Student presentations (St. John's Bible, MTC Life), Busing for Special Events, Tournament Fees, Special Crafts (First Communion, Catholic Education Week and Craft Club), Annie JR Play, English and French Public Speaking, school team uniforms, Joy Day (advent) materials, Advent and Easter displays and floral arrangements for school, prayer centre materials and Advent wreaths,
- **Discretionary Fund** for students in need of assistance (\$4,500)
 - o (i.e., school lunches, functions, field trips, memorial donations, etc.)
- Graduation Expenses (\$1000) diploma folders, award plaques, engraving, subsidizing costs for student celebration (i.e., refreshments, DJ, decorations), Mandarin luncheon and busing to Brampton and yearbooks for all graduates
- Catholic School Council Events (\$1200) offsetting costs of our Advent Gingerbread Family Night, Math Night, Literacy Night, Guest speakers and Shrove Tuesday pancakes
- Classroom Enhancements- (\$8,000.00)
 - (i.e.,) CD players, speakers, bean bag chairs, noise cancelling headsets, carpets, calculators, U-tables, kindergarten classroom furniture/supplies,
