### EQAO ASSESSMENTS OF READING, WRITING AND MATHEMATICS

Similar to previous years, our Grade 3 and 6 students will participate in the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) Primary and Junior Division assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

Students will be required to complete three test booklets: one mathematics booklet, one reading booklet and one writing booklet. The types of questions in the booklets will be familiar to your child as they are based on the kinds of work your child has been doing throughout the year. The total amount of time that the students will spend on the testing will be six hours that is generally spread over the course of two or three days. Sample questions can be viewed on the EQAO website at www.eqao.com.

We ask that you make every effort to avoid holidays and booking appointments during the week of the assessment and to try to make sure your children are in attendance each day during the assessment. The EQAO assessment results help us to continue to improve upon the quality Catholic education offered to your children. Additional specific information regarding the assessments will be sent home to our Grade 3 and 6 parents. The assessment has been scheduled to take place from May 22 to May 29.

# The Use of Technology and Digital Citizenship – HCDSB Operating Policy 1-43

The following reminder is in response to an increase in the number of issues brought forward to the Principal's attention with regard to the appropriate use of personal electronic devices.

The Board provides users with access to appropriate technology to support teaching and learning, and to enable efficient Board administration and communication. Technology, including personally owned devices, must be used appropriately for these intended purposes. This Use of Technology and Digital Citizenship policy supports the principles and expectations of the Board's Safe Schools policies (II-39, II-40), and the Board's commitment to providing education that is distinctively Catholic, nurturing the call to love and serve by creating positive climates for learning and working.

The policy applies to the use of personally owned technology, including personally owned computers and mobile devices, when used on Board property or when used to access Board resources. Inappropriate use of personally owned technology, while on or off school property, which has a negative impact on school climate will result in a full investigation and necessary action will be taken, where appropriate. Consequences for inappropriate use are outlined both in the Code of Conduct as well in the Board's Safe Schools policies (II-39, II-40).

Please DO NOT send in food items, as a treat for your child's class. We must protect the safety of our anaphylactic children. We appreciate the extra effort required to comply with this request and ask for your understanding as we enforce this very important protocol.

As well please do not send sunbutter or soybutter or any of the products that resemble peanut butter. Staff are unable to differentiate these foods from peanut butter.

#### **EARLY PICK UPS**

Please write a note in your child's agenda if you will be picking them up early.

If it is a last minute appointment come to the office, allowing for time for us to locate your child.

It is not necessary to call the office in advance.



### PARKING LOT / KISS and RIDE / BUS Reminders:

Every school day, almost 700 students and staff make their way into and out of our school either by walking, being driven or taking a bus. This carefully choreographed movement of people and vehicles requires that all parties remember patience and safety as they move about the parking lots and Kiss and Ride. A few safety reminders for our families:

- There is lots of room in the main parking lot in the morning –
  if you need to get out of your vehicle to undo seat belts or car
  seats, please park and walk your child(ren) to the front sidewalk using the cross walk and "crossing guard"
- Kiss and Ride lane is meant for quick and easy drop off in the morning. We ask that drivers remain in the vehicle and that students exit using only the left side passenger door(s) directly onto the sidewalk. Please follow the directions of staff to move as far forward as possible when dropping off students and watch for the directions of the "crossing guard" and school buses.
- Our "Crossing Guard" staff member works hard to manage pedestrians from the parking lot, cars in the Kiss and Ride lane and school buses. Thank you to all for watching carefully ly and following the directions given so that everyone comes to school and back to home safely.
- Families who are walking from the main parking lot are asked to remember to follow the directions of the "crossing guard" and always check before heading across the "crosswalk". Parents are kindly reminded that the "crosswalk" is the only way to travel between the school sidewalk and the parking lot.
- We have a number of buses that transport students to and from our school each day. In the morning, they use the right hand lane of the Kiss and Ride lane to enter the school area and their drop off zone. In the afternoon, they use the Kiss and Ride lane to get close to the sidewalk in front of the school. Thank you for giving them room to manoever and safely unload or load students and not to block their access.

Please remember that yard supervision and staff who assist with Kiss and Ride and "crossing guard" begin at 8:05 am. Students should not be dropped off before 8:05 am as they are not supervised by school staff. Students from the YMCA program may be on the yard prior to 8:05 am, however, they are supervised by YMCA staff. Parents who walk their children to school are reminded to please refrain from entering the school yard in the morning and stay at the fence or gate. Parents dropping off students after the entry bell at 8:20 for the start of the school day, are reminded they must report to the office and not proceed to classrooms. We maintain this expectation for the safety of all our students.



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### **LUNCH PROCEDURES**

A reminder that <u>students are not permitted to leave the school premises without a signed and dated note from parents/guardians</u>. Verbal permission by phone, emails and texts will not be accepted. Parents who pick up students for lunch are asked to meet them in the front lobby.



### **BUS PROCEDURES**

Please note that Halton Student Transportation Service Operating Procedure HS-1-004 states that "Requests for changes made on an ad hoc basis or for a limited time, such as switching buses to visit friends or go to a babysitter's house when parents are travelling or on holidays, shall **not** be considered as courtesy seat requests and **shall not be approved**.
