Achieving: Meeting the Needs of All Learners

- 1) Educators will plan for rich learning tasks that offer multiple entry points and provide options in regards to various modes for students to communicate key understandings.
- 2) Educators will implement daily Math activities to promote number fluency and automaticity of number facts regardless of Math strand being instructed.
- 3) Ensure that all evaluation OF learning includes representations of a student's achievement as taken from observations, conversations and student products (triangulation of evidence).

Believing: Celebrating our Catholic faith and aspiring to be models of Christ

- 1) Educators will use grade level Focus on Faith themes and Essential Questions along with the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations when framing "big ideas" explored through student inquiry in the classroom.
- 2) Educators will promote the use of the "Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ" family activities as accessed through the "at home" portal (currently Grades 1-3 only).
- 3) School and Parish will partner to educate parents on themes and topics related to growing and maintaining strong Catholic families and a better understanding of the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations.

Belonging: Embracing Relationships and sustaining safe, welcoming schools

- 1) School to continue programs to promote student belonging and student voice (Grade 8 Ambassadors, Grade 7 and 5 SPARK Mentorship Program and the Staff/Student Invisible Mentor Program).
- 2) School, in partnership with the Catholic School Council, to increase opportunities for parental engagement in the life of our school.
- 3) School administration to allow for increased student voice in the planning and implementing of activity days throughout the school year (ex. Healthy Living Day, Civvies Days etc.).
