Catholicity and Community of Culture and Caring (Believing and Belonging):

Holocaust Memorial Day: Wednesday, January 27 – Classes participated in a prayer service/liturgy. Grade 8 class participated in age appropriate discussions/lesson.

Bell Let's Talk Day: Thursday, January 28 – Mrs. Paul, our school CYC created virtual presentations to share with staff/students on topics related to mental health and coping strategies. Return to School Plan:

Routines/expectations that will continue once students are back to school:

- Students go directly to their class lines in the morning when they arrive to school.
- Staggered entry into the building in the morning and after recess times/lunch time. Students consistently use same door.
- For the remainder of the winter months, students will continue to use lockers to store boots, winter coats, snow pants, hats and mittens/gloves. All other items will still be stored in the classrooms to avoid students lingering in the hallways. Students use hand sanitizer before they enter the classroom.
- Masks worn at all times when students are in the school other than when eating
 or drinking or when teachers are giving mask breaks in the classroom when
 weather is not favourable for outside. New change effective Feb. 8: Masks must
 be worn outside before school, at recess/lunch times and at dismissal time.
 Parents need to wear masks when on school property.
- Parents are encouraged to have their children arrive at school on time. If children arrive late, they go directly to class to avoid congregating in the office area.
- Use of hand sanitizer or washing of hands at the sink with soap and water has been implemented by the teachers numerous times throughout the day.
- Recess Time/Lunch Time: 2 separate recess times and lunch times to ensure students play in their designated zones.
- Washroom Use only one student at a time in the washroom.
- Students remain in their own classrooms all day. Only exception, Mrs. Leahy's grade 3's will go to Mrs. Holowatsky's class for Science.

- Disinfectant sprays and wipes are used often by teachers in classrooms.
- Essential visitors only and meetings are to take place virtually as much as possible.
- No lunch services to date.
