PRINCIPAL'S REPORT	VINCE CHININEA
Review of Distance Learning:	
 staff responded and did the best they can given the timeframe and adjustments as new information was released during this time report cards going home on June 24th Parent Pick-up of Student Material: will occur on Wednesday June 24 (and possibly June 25th if needed) bags will be prepared by family last name families will be sent specific emails based on their last name, including the date, where to pick (map and directions), a link with times based on their locations. For example, "Kiss and Ride – Station One" once a family selects a time, it is no longer available (although there will be more than one time slot for each location, but not exceeding the amount to maintain safety/social distancing protocols) 	

Graduation:

- Friday June 19
 - prerecorded graduation ceremony (videos from Director, trustee, priest and valedictorian)
 - drive-up Graduation: 30 min schedules with stations set up for a certain number of families for students to pick up diplomas, awards, grad sweater, and special gift
 - cars will be in kiss and ride and one family will come out at a time to take pics (will have banner and balloons set up)
- question from a parent about timing of the graduation as there are parents that are deemed essential workers that are working set schedules with long hours; how will the school accommodate?; also would apply for pick-up of personal items
 - Mr. Chininea will coordinate directly with those parents

September Update:

- we do not have clear direction about what start-up will look like; will be one of the following:
 - 1. all students come back
 - 2. continue with Remote Learning
 - 3. combination of one and two
- with the three options, we have to be flexible enough to move from one scenario to the other
- class placements have been completed
- we will pass along any information as we get it, however the board will likely communicate the plan for start-up

 FINANCE we refunded \$20,000 for pizza - so no revenue from pizza we still have \$14,000 that was not spent \$2200 deposit for graduation venue - carryover is \$16000, but included is misc deposits; will actually be a little more since we won't have to pay the deposit for graduation venue or bbq next year Sheila Trudell: GL called "External Charities" is used for Lenten Kits for Kids - there will be a little left there from \$ that came in from the Valentine's Dance, since that usually goes right to Lenten Kits (since we can't refund the Valentine's donations since it was change that came in) usually the External Charities is in and out - but this year there will be a little sitting there from Valentine's Day dance donations Graduation Plaques are in the process of being ordered we normally collect \$50/child for grad, but this year we are not charging the parents 	INKA ELLENBRAND
